MUSHROOM FAIR

The sixth annual Mushroom Fair of the Colorado Mycological Society will be held at Denver Botanic Gardens, 1005 York St., on Sunday, August 23, from 11 a.m. to 5 p.m.

It will feature identification of wild mushrooms of Colorado with color slide shows, natural habitat displays, cooking suggestions, commercial mushroom information, mushroom related arts and crafts, mushroom books and other exhibits. Admission to the Fair will be \$1.50 for persons 16 to 65 years of age, 50 cents for seniors and children 7 to 15, children under 7 free.

The public is invited to bring in mushrooms for identification. Specimens should be wrapped in waxed paper and refrigerated if collected more than an hour or two before the Fair.
